- 1884 The American Kennel Club was organized.
- The original Great Dane Club of America was organized in Chicago. It was the fourth breed club to become a member of the American kennel Club.
- The Great Dane Club of America, Inc. was organized in New York by Mr. A. H. Heppner. This present club succeeded the original club.
- 1939 The Great Dane Club of Cleveland was founded by:
  Creighton and Lillian Hayne
  Oliver and Lil Owens
  Otto Schulle

This landmark meeting was held in a bar on Franklin Avenue or Blvd. in Cleveland, Ohio.

- 1941 The Great Dane Club of Cleveland was recognized by The Great Dane Club of America.
- 1942 to The Great Dane Club of Cleveland was held together
  1945 by the women in the club until 1945 when World War
  II ended. Many of the male club members were in
  the armed services during this period of time.
- 1946 The first Specialty show was held with the Chagrin Valley Kennel Club.
- 1949-50 The Specialty show was held with Chagrin Valley Kennel Club, Gates Mills, Ohio. Dane club members ran the food concession for the show. Two extra classes for local dogs were offered. Twenty-two members were on the rolls.
- 1951-52 Specialties were held in conjunction with Chagrin Valley Kennel Club and Western Reserve Kennel Club. Membership increased to 35.
- 1953-54 1954 was our first independent Specialty show. It was held in the Cleveland Public Auditorium the Friday evening before the Cleveland Classic. Wynn Suck, a well-known handler, judged an entry of fifty-seven. Meetings were held at Dr. and Mrs. Bittel's home. Summer 1953 marked the first picnic/puppy match. The 1954 picnic match had 37 entries. There were 38 members.
- 1955-56 The Dane Data was started. Membership was 30.
  The January Specialty had an entry of 52. The
  August Specialty in conjunction with Chagrin
  Valley had an entry of 43. The Picnic match,
  Christmas Party, and pot-luck suppers were well
  attended.

- In 1957 a Specialty was with Chagrin Valley KC.
  In 1958 a Specialty was with Western Reserve. The
  Rover Award was presented for the first time.
  This is for the outstanding member of the year
  chosen by the members for (1) service to the club,
  (2) service to the breed, (3) good sportsmanship.
  Forty-six(46) members.
- 1959-60 Fifty eight members.
  As members of the Ohio Specialty Association, the Specialty show was held in June. Training class was started for members. In 1959 six champions finished and in 1960 there were 3. The Cleveland Press Charity Parade featured club members and their Danes parading in formation and with floats.
- 1961-63 1963 Mrs. Robert E. Bittel (Helen) was the first woman president of the Great Dane Club of Cleveland. Sixty-one members. Social events and training classes were held.
- 1964-66 Fifty five members. Many more Danes were bred as demand was great. Specialties had grown to 100 entries. Our match was well attended. Dane Data had grown. Many socials were held. Educational speakers were part of our meetings.
- 1967-69 Fifty three members. 1969 marked the first sweepstakes held with the Specialty. Social events helped hold the club together. Potluck Dinner, Clam Bake, Steak Roast, Puppy Picnic Match, Buffet and Pre-Snow Dinner. Training classes continued.
- 1970-72 Membership reached a high of 83. Many new people joined the ranks of breeders. All of the established activities continued. The July picnic match was a highlight of the year along with the June Specialty. Danes In Distress began (finding good homes for unfortunate Great Danes). Donations were made to American Dog Owners Association.
- 1973-75 Eighty five members. The club continued to support the worthy causes: ADDA, Danes In Distress, and bloat research. Two Specialty Shows and Sweepstakes have become tradition as well as Dane Data, our monthly publication. Our training/handling classes were still proving their value in the show ring as many members show their own dogs. Our July match was very special attended by many out-of-state people.

- 1976-78 Seventy two members. Our July match has been so successful we added one in September. In 1976 we added obedience to the matches. 1978 marked the 25th year of our July matches. The matches along with our training and handling classes were very helpful to new Dane owners. Club members received plagues for completing championships. Socials continued to bind our membership together as friends and competitors.
- 1979-81 Sixty five members. Our club donated \$100. to the Morris Animal Foundation. Our annual Specialty Show and Sweepstakes continued to be a success with majors every year. The two puppy matches were also well attended. Our socials, training classes and informative meetings contributed to the success of our club. Three dogs completed championships.
- 1982-84 Membership was forty.

  1984 Mr. Creighton Hayne, a founder of the club, passed away. His knowledge and expertise have been missed.

  Each year we had two socials, a spring pizza party and a fall clambake, as well as our puppy matches and potlucks. The combination of learning and social fun work well for us. Eight member-owned dogs became champions.
- 1985-89 Membership was thirty-five.
  The death of Dr. Robert Bittel was a tragic loss to the Breed, his family, and all who knew him.
  During this same time period we also mourned Dick and Dorothy Bohunek, who were great contributors to our club and the Breed. Loyal, dedicated members continued to carry out all of the club functions. The show must go on!
- 1990-92 Many new members have joined. Interests vary from conformation to obedience to Dane rescue. Educating members and new Dane owners in the general public continues to be a goal. Two Specialties and Sweepstakes are offered yearly. Supported entries at all-breed shows encourage better entries.

## Great Dane (Lub of Cleveland

The club was founded in 1939 and (reighton Hayne was a charter member

Dane Data was first published in March of 1956. Jane Gregory (Thompson) wrote, Charley Huxtable typed and Bob Phillips did the covers. In September of 1959, Janes husband Greg died and Jane asked me (Helen Bittel) to take over. Helen put out the Dane Data for several years with Dick Bohunek and Lou Kovacs doing the covers. Since then, Dane Data has had several editors.

Roven Award. The idea for the award came from the three original people who started Dane Data - Jane, (harley and Bob. The first Rover Award was presented at the (hristmas party in December of 1957. These three set up the requirements and they have stayed the same through the years. No reason they cannot be changed if the club desires.

Puppy Match - The first puppy match was held in 1953. The first two were held in Peninsuly (Pender's) - one was held at a Metro park, one in New London, and the rest have been held at "Bittel's Barnyard." Am not sure when the first Fall puppy match was held, but probably about 10 years ago. Bittels had the first ones (3 or 4) and the rest have been held at the Depenbrocks.

Specialty Show - Our first Specialty Show with the Ohio Specialties (Lub was held in 1959. The Boxer club and the Dane club met and worked together getting other breeds (about 10 in all) to join, and the Ohio Specialties (Lub was formed. Over the years the other breeds slowly dropped out, preferring to put on their own specialties. I think they started out showing at the Solon High School and were in Berea once or twice, but were at the Polo grounds for the most years.

Jen Year Awards - This started in 1965 and members get an award after being in the club 10 consecutive years. I have the printed forms and Ty Klevay writes in script, the names of the recipients. These also are given at the Christmas party.

These are just some pertinent facts about the club and its awards. I've listed the winners of the Rover Awards and Ien Year Awards on a separate sheet and you can add on in the future. I'll take care of the 10 Year Awards for a while at least. The above is not necessarily the duties of the Dane Data editor - just the Rover Award really. Just thought this information should be in younger hands It's just some information I have kept over the years.

(found the following, which I wrote for the 1982 Dane Data. will print it in its entirety and you can pick out whatever you want to use.)

Dane Data was 25 years old last year (1981). The first issue came out in March of 1956 and had three people working on it. One person (Jane Gregory) wrote it - Charley Muxtable printed it and Bob Thillips did the covers. There have been a variety of editors since. I did it for about & years, with Lou Kovacs (my brother-in-law) doing the covers and then Dick Bohunek did them. I think Diane Gackson, Norma Kentris were a couple of the past editors and more recently Gloria (ostanza, and now Kathy Baraga. Unfortunately, the problem of getting news has always been there. If the editor goes to a lot of dog shows (as was trueiin my case) then she has the results, but people just forget to send in their wins on anything else that would be of interest, and sometimes your editor really has to scrounge. So help your editor out and send in any items of interest.

# Puppy Match

The July Puppy Match washeld in 1953. The first two were held in Peninsula, one was held at a Metro Park, one in New London and the nest have been held at 4Bittels Barnyard". The puppy match is a sort of service to the breed since it brings out novice dog owners and is a good place to compare one's own dog with other puppies the same age. And to see how dog shows are conducted. Plus - they are fur!!

## Rover Award

The Rover Award was first started in 1957 and is basicly a way of giving recognition to club members who have given of their time and efforts over the past year or years, to help keep the club active, and for the "Betterment of the Breed." It is always hard to choose one person for the year (and sometime there might be a tie) but if you will check your nominee's name against the criteria set for the award by the original committee, it will make it a little easier. The qualifications are:-

- 1) Service to the (Lub
- 2) Service to the Breed
- 3) Good Sportsmanship.

Numbers one and three are pretty much self-explanatory. Number two means any way the breed is promoted. Not just exhibiting, but selective breeding, publicity on the breed etc.

Ballots are passed out at the Nov. meeting and will be collected then, or you may mail it in. The award is presented at the Christmas party. On the ballots will be printed where to mail them and the degdline for getting them in.

(Quite often club members are not aware of who does what, so you might want members to send in nominations telling why he/she thinks that person deserves the Rover Award.
